Mt Alexander Planning Department is waiting on amendments to the proposal for a possible April date and, following receipt of these amendments, the proposal will be re-advertised, with opportunities for further community response.

Liaison with Mt Alexander Planning Department and Events Coordinator is ongoing and concerned community members have sought a joint meeting with Mt Alexander and Hepburn Shires to discuss events policy, particularly in relation to large events being held in small rural communities.
