Neighbourhood building and community wellbeing e.g. emergency telephone trees,

- History in story- valuing and sharing the knowledge of local memory keepers and documenting stories;
- Community picnics including Bullboar and cheese making days, drawing on our Swiss-Italian heritage;
- Community facilities e.g. community picnic table, barbeque, solar panels at the hall;
- Communication- keeping us informed and in touch e.g. the *Chronicle*, community email list and Yandoit website.

We've made a good start on a number of priorities but all require further time and commitment. Share your ideas as we review what has worked well, what could be improved and what else might be added to our community priorities over the next year or two.

History in Story -The creek

For our fourth *history in story* a good crowd of locals gathered for a guided walk along the creek, lead by Paul Righetti, stopping to appreciate rock formations, pools, water flows and creek vegetation. The walk finished at the site of the old cable swing bridge, one of a few creek crossing points last century. We then adjourned to Righetti's shearing shed, still smelling strongly of lanoline after this season's sheep shearing, to listen to memory keepers Beth Higgins, Eric Sartori, Greg Pridmore and Lawrence Righetti, with additions from Joy Sartori and Ric Higgins. Stories and images included:

- changing flora and fauna along the creek such as rare anchor plants, woolly tea tree, mountain galaxia fish and freshwater mussels;
- diving into deep waterholes showcased by an 1970's Higgin's video clip;
- building Newstead's water supply channel

- from Sartori's weir in the 1930's;
- significant floods and droughts over the past century including 100 years of rainfall figures collected by Lawrence Righetti;
- and clear signs of Dja Dja Wurrung presence along the creeks signified by canoe trees and stone scatters.

Early Fire in the Fire Season
