AN OLD TIME DANCE STORY

Yandoit's Old Time Dance on 31st March had an unexpected visitor, Jim Stapleton from Echuca, who is 104 years of age. Lyle Fletcher from Ballarat, a regular to our dances, said, "Greg, come and meet my uncle Jim". Now Lyle is nearly old enough to be my father, and I thought how old must Jim be, so I asked him and he said, 104. As I expressed some disbelief, to prove it he then produced his current driving licence, with date of birth 1913. As Jim met other dancers during the night, he was introduced to Jean McDonald who, with great astonishment, recognised him as the "Jim" she used to work for at the Bendigo Dairy Board 40 years ago and hadn't seen since. Jean was tickled pink to meet up with Jim again after all those years and reminisce about old times.

Jim has an association with Yandoit, as his brother Jack married Isobel Sartori from Yandoit. During the depression Jack got Jim a job at a Yandoit gold mine and Jim remembers working at the 400ft level, up to his knees in water.

Jim and his wife Nell (who passed away last year at 99) first came to the Yandoit dance 75 years ago. He also remembers going to a dance at the Sandon hall about the same time.



Jim managed a couple of dances on the night and demonstrated his prowess on the mouth organ, entertaining us with a couple of tunes. Jim is still a member of the Echuca Rich River Golf Club (which he founded) and plays bowls 3 days per week. What a great privilege it was to meet Jim but unfortunately I missed asking his secret to a long life. The next Yandoit Old Time Dance will be Friday
