

JONES-REECES ROAD CLYDESDALE REPAIR UPDATE

An update from Tim Powell, Senior Projects engineer at Hepburn Shire Council:

Following the community meeting at Clydesdale hall in February to discuss the details design, the floodway reconstruction works were tendered. Hepburn Shire is currently going through the process of awarding a contract which is yet to be finalised. However, the preferred Contractor has indicated a start date in mid-April. It

should be noted that there is a lead time on the precast culverts so the actual start date is somewhat out of the hands of the Contractor. The expected construction window is around 4 weeks and detours will be in place during that time because of the need to close the road. Once the start date is firmed there will be a letter drop to affected residents and a Facebook post on Council's page. The construction process is highly dependent on weather.
