Unfortunately, in spite of a huge effort by Carlene Sartori and the Hall committee, the pick my project application for Yandoit Hall, designed to repair the hall and to restore the integrity of the original building, was not successful. The competition was



stiff with 150 projects to choose from across central highlands region, which includes Hepburn Shire.

The Hall committee as well as the Chronicle editors encouraged as many as possible to vote before the deadline. This resulted in 102 votes for the Yandoit Hall project. Most of the successful projects received around 200+ votes. The Hall committee is now in the process of seeking alternative funds to ensure much needed repairs to our community gathering place are able to be undertaken. Our
