MEETING WITH NEW COUNCILLORS-REPORT

In spite of the heat, a good number of locals gathered at Clydesdale Hall in January to meet our 4 new ward councillors- Jen Bray, Lesley Hewitt and Juliet Simpson from Hepburn, and Matthew Driscoll from Mt Alexander shire. Since then Hepburn's community engagement policy and strategy has been developed. The policy and a summary are available at:

Some issues raised at the meeting included: additional tip tickets being requested when recycling material has been separated .This is a disincentive and raises questions of consistency and whether the shire or the contractor make the rules at the Hepburn's tip? Some other concerns were: use of glyphosate and leaching into waterways; depletion of our underground water; and mining exploration in the local area. We agreed to hold Community-councillor meetings on a seasonal basis, every quarter. Look out for details in the next *Chronicle*. **Our Community plan for Yandoit, Clydesdale and Franklinford** is 8 years old. It needs updating to develop a clear vision and direction for our communities. We envisage starting this process mid year. Some initial ideas for consideration include: a sharing shed/tool library; preferred options for weed management; tree register and protocols; reconciliation with first nations people; history – launch of written & photographic panels at Clydesdale, and further oral history-in-story sessions; water security and concerns about underground syphoning; & local sharing economies. PAY THE RENT SCHEME

The scheme *Pay The Rent* was endorsed in the 1970s by the National Aboriginal and Islander Health organisation. It is a way of acknowledging that all Australians live on and benefit from Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander land that was taken without consent, payment or treaty. The scheme enables other Australians to contribute "rent" directly to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander led groups & organisations: https://paytherent.net.au/

In recent times I have been stopping along Limestone Road and High street to pull out the thistles and recently I attended at the Cemetery (I'm a trustee so I am allowed to be interested and take action) and cleaned up all the thistles within the fences and immediately outside the fences. Someone had cut down about 10 large thistles but had left them on the ground in the Cemetery and they had matured and were ready to spread their seeds far and wide. I collected them too and am now waiting for the fire season to end to burn them. I would like the community to help with a list of places where the thistle thrives or even where there is a single one or two and we might be able to form a Landcare anti thistle group and finish off this terrible weed. If you see a thistle pull it out or cut it down but take it away and put it in a bag. Don't leave it lying on the ground or it will mature and allow the spread of seeds. More next Chronicle.
