Regular church services stopped more than a year ago at Yandoit's Uniting Church due to the smallness and aging nature of the parish. However, for some time locals have expressed keenness to retain the church in community hands, as a space for community events including music concertsthe acoustics are as remarkable as the

building is beautiful. Discussions are underway with the Uniting Church parish in Castlemaine to explore the possibility of preserving this historical building for community use, - an alternative to putting the building up for sale. Did you know that Yandoit's Uniting Church, originally Methodist, was built around 150 years ago by local people using locally made and locally fired bricks. It has been well maintained and is in excellent condition. Over the past few years the church has hosted concerts and events as part of Ballarat's Fine Music festival, Daylesford's Words in Winter festival. The Christmas carol service, with Castlemaine's Peace Choir, has been an annual specialty. There are a number of groups including music schools from around our area who are interested in using the space in an ongoing way.
