NEXT MINING CONCERNS MEETING

Next **Saturday**, **September 18th at 2.30pm** we will meet again outside at Yandoit hall. The focus of this third community meeting is to prepare questions we want to ask mining companies. There will also be sharing of further information gathered by working groups. Our August community meeting was attended by around 50 locals (plus apologies from people unable to travel from Melbourne due to lockdown. Information from the various working groups was presented including:

- legal rights and obligations of mining companies including code of practice;
- environmental impact and endangered species nominated in the Biodiversity Atlas of Australia;
- protection via *Trust for Nature* and *Bush Heritage* covenants;
- requirement to comply with *Cultural Heritage Management Plans* on both public and private land;
- fire risk management at mining sites;
- exploration drilling at Yandoit;
- approaches to meet with us by mining companies;
- impact on waterways, especially arsenic;
- potential impact on livelihoods;
- increased quantity and speed of traffic, impact on roads and wildlife deaths;

Draft letters to the mining companies have been prepared. The YCF Planning Group website has a bulletin board which includes all the above and more information. Access is for community members only at the moment. Contact James to

WHAT TO DO ABOUT FERAL PIGS?

Feral Pigs have arrived in Yandoit and surrounds. They are causing significant damage to the forest and private land, eg near corner of Glamorgan and Yandoit Creek Roads. So far 2 pigs have been shot and a number poisoned. Another 20 have been caught on camera. Keep an eye out and report any sightings to Council or DELWP- David Blythe- mob. 0437 812 384.

YANDOIT UNITING CHURCH IN COMMUNITY HANDS

The congregation is no longer gathering for church services, and the church was de-commissioned earlier this year. After



many years of talking about the possibility of Yandoit Uniting Church remaining in community hands (rather than being sold off), an agreement has been struck with Castlemaine Uniting Church Parish Council for the Community Planning Group to lease the Church, for a 12 month period, with the option of extending the lease if both parties are agreeable. This is an exciting new chapter for this beautiful and historical church,

built in the 1870's by local people out of locally made bricks, maintained and cared for by parishioners, nestled in bushland and with wonderful acoustics. We expect the lease to be signed around mid-October. Already there are music concerts being planned, Words in Winter events, potential marriages, choir performances and more. INCORPORATION- COMMUNITY PLANNING GROUP

Notice of meeting: Sunday October 3rd, 2021, 3pm at Yandoit Uniting Church. The Yandoit, Clydesdale and Franklinford Community Planning Group is taking steps to become Incorporated. The group formed around 11-12 years ago to identify needs, aspirations and concerns for our communities along the creek. As a result of that process a community plan was developed, and in the next few months we will be renewing that plan as a community. . Over the years the Community Planning Group has done a number of things such as: organising our local history in story sessions, arranging meetings with our ward councillors, publishing and distributing the Chronicle, organising community markets, helping bring internationally- renowned classical musicians to play in our town and, more recently, initiating meetings to discuss and share information about mining concerns. By incorporating, the Planning Group becomes a separate legal entity, protecting individual community members who contribute to the varied work of the group. Incorporation enables activities such as opening a bank account and taking up the lease on the Yandoit Uniting church (see article above). To incorporate, we need to have a meeting of people who identify as members of the

Community Planning Group- (the Group is open to everyone across our communities), gain at least 50% vote to go ahead at that meeting and elect officers bearers for the group.
