COMMUNITY PLANNING GROUP REPORT

Our Community Planning Group meeting in February at Clydesdale Hall was well attended. Committee members of the newly incorporated Community Planning Group were introduced. The interim Hirers Agreement for the church has been signed. John updated on storm firewood distribution to raise funds for local community needs. Concerns were raised about a planning application for Clarkes Road Franklinford in which farm land will be subdivided for housing- also about significant works which have begun prior to approval- and the process for lodging objections. Our community plan is due to be updated- see above. Locals can register interest in Renewable Newstead's solar energy initiative. Mining concerns were discussed further - John Combes indicated that there's not much new to report locally and that the Canadian company Nubian's share price has dropped significantly. Debra has established a website: No mining Yandoit region- and she welcomes any feedback people have regarding what they need or want to see on the site :<u>https://nominingyandoitregion.com</u> Visitor, John Lewis, from Elphinstone, shared his research into gold mining in central Victoria. There's renewed interest in gold mining for many reasons including: significant advances in technology that allow for sophisticated imagery and the use of artificial intelligence which helps collate large amounts of historic data; the increased price of gold; big Canadian companies making big profits and

paying very little tax in Australia; new technologies which allow companies to drill much deeper beyond the water table (which can have various negative effects on the environment). Governments are also keen on the economic advantages. John reminded us that we don't own anything under the surface of our property; we can say No to any company coming onto our land without a signed agreement but eventually the process could end up in court. There are various examples of success in stopping mining and if we are mobilised and prepared we have a better chance of succeeding. Ideally a change in the mining laws is needed.
