TRANSMISSION LINES

Since the early 1960s a 220,000 volt powerline has traversed Werona, Yandoit Hills & Clydesdale on its route between



Ballarat to Bendigo. In 2019 the market operator (AEMO) determined that Victoria needs a stronger power line to NSW (VNI-WEST) & affirmed that the (yet to be built) Ballarat North & Bendigo Substations are on the preferred route.

The Ballarat North substation placement and powerlines are being challenged by Hepburn and Moorabool resident groups (including Piss off Ausnet). The proposed route for the new line will most likely follow the existing powerline easement & this will be determined over the next few years. The line is schedule for construction from 2029-32. The new towers will be massive, up to 80m tall & will carry 6 conductors (the existing towers are 35m tall with 3 conductors). More info on AEMO website: https://tinyurl.com/Yandoittowers. BRIEF REPORT ON COMMUNITY PLANNING MEETING

The community meeting with ward councillors, at the end of May, was well attended. Councillors alerted us to their budget process & invited locals to make submissions. Community grants are available via both Hepburn and Mt Alexander shires. Hepburn Shire is seeking feedback on both the arts and culture strategy as well as the positive ageing strategy. Participate Hepburn's website - https://participate.hepburn.vic.gov.au/ is a useful place to find out what's happening at the local government level and to contribute your ideas. The community meeting included reports on mining activity, proposed transmission line extensions, and Yandoit Cultural's upcoming events- see updates in this edition. Concerns about increased traffic and speed on our local roads was also raised. Our next 5 year community plan, in the process of being developed this year, will help determine future priorities and projects. A number of suggestions have been received and further ideas from community members are welcomed, focussing on what we value and on what new initiatives will contribute towards the kind of place and community we want to live in. RENEWABLE NEWSTEAD SOLAR FARM

Renewable Newstead is working to have a local solar farm built. Estimated milestone dates have been revised. Up until a few weeks ago, it looked like the farm would be completed by the end of this year but now building is likely to commence by the end of 2022 and finish in 2023. The delay relates to a changed regulation that came into effect at an awkward time as well as the ever-changing electricity network. The good news is that Renewable Newstead is still optimistic that the farm will go ahead. Local people are being asked to complete an expression of interest form to purchase electricity from the solar farm. So far 136 households have expressed interest. By filling out the form there is no obligation to actually go ahead but it does help Renewable Newstead understand the likely number of customers. In turn, an indication of possible customer numbers helps to meet government funding requirements. If you haven't already filled out an expression of interest go to https://renewablenewstead.com.au/ and click on the button 'Show Me the Deal'. Renewable Newstead will acknowledge your expression of interest and keep you up to date with the latest developments.

CLARKES RD FRANKLINFORD PLANNING APPLICATION TO VCAT

The applicant for the Clarkes Rd Franklinford development - Planning Application 3089- has lodged a submission with VCAT after Hepburn Shire rejected the application on the basis of inadequate wastewater disposal, especially given proximity to the creek.
