PREPARING FOR FIRE DANGER PERIOD: As

we're now in the Fire Danger Period there are some essential jobs to do around the house and property. Some considerations would be: Move your winter woodpile away from the house or sheds; Prune tree branches so they are not overhanging the roof or touching walls; Clear your gutters; Reduce ground level fuel loads from around trees and shrubs by clearing undergrowth; Keep grass shorter than 10cm.; Remove leaves and twigs from around your property; Test anything that is part of your fire plan such as sprinklers, pumps and generators: Check that your home and contents insurance is current and includes a level of cover in line with current building standards and regulations; Make sure your household has a Bushfire Survival Plan, review and test it in case it needs to be updated. COUNCIL ELECTIONS: Elections for both Mt Alexander and Hepburn Shires have been completed. Early in the new year we will hold a community meeting at which all our councillors will be invited so they can become more familiar with the strengths and challenges of our communities.

OUR LOCAL BIODIVERSITY: Did you know we have native mistletoe growing here? It is a parasitic plant of



Eucalyptus species, not usually causing harm unless host trees are under stress already. There are a few different types of mistletoe growing around these parts all distinguished by different leaves and flowers. In order to spread seed the Mistletoe relies on one bird, the Mistletoe bird to eat the berries and then deposits the seed on host branches. An interesting symbiotic relationship indeed!
